TIFFE provides services to students with disabilities in our public schools. Our services include Behavioral Intensive Support Services (BISS), Parent Trainers (PT), and Paraprofessionals (Para). We work collaboratively with schools to assist students with special needs in achieving goals of their Individualized Education Plan (IEP). In addition to classrooms, these services are also provided in a family's home or in the community to generalize the student's skills beyond the school setting.

DOH SERVICES

Early Intervention Services may include developmental assessments which address developmental delays in areas such as physical, cognitive, communication, social-emotional and adaptive skills and abilities. These services are provided in the home, preschool, daycare and community settings for children ages 0-3.

Intensive In-Home and Other Related Services provide mental health services for children and adolescents with serious emotional and behavioral disorders. Our providers work in teams that include a child's school, family, and other individuals or agencies that help the child reach his goals. Services are provided in homes and communities.

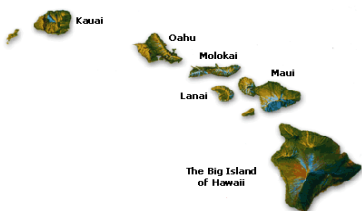

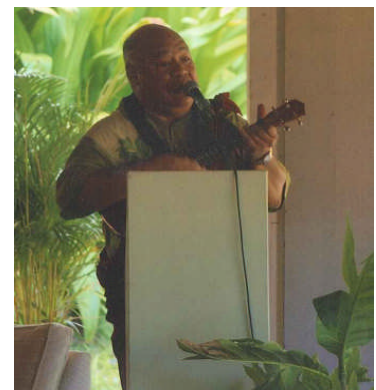

TIFFE's TRAINING & EDUCATIONAL SERVICES

Training and education is provided through the combination of instructional presentations and experiential activities to enhance the participant's learning through process and integration, whether it be members of the community or service providers. The basis for many of our educational services have come from the nationally recognized Nurturing Programs. These programs have a proactive approach in helping parents and children increase their skills and create a nurturing environment for families to thrive and grow. It is also recognized by the Office of Juvenile Justice as on the top twenty best practice programs.

Training topics include but are not limited to:

- Stress Management
- Parenting / Family Development
- Cultural Sensitivity
- Case Management
- Anger Management

Community classes and workshops are open to the general public and are offered regularly throughout the year.

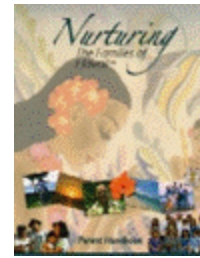
- Parenting Classes for the public and those remanded by the court systems.

PREVENTION PROGRAMS

Nurturing the Families of Hawai'i (funded by DHS) is a **FREE** statewide group based program. Groups are 1.5 to 2 hours in length and meet once a week for 12 weeks. Nurturing the Families of Hawai'i is based upon the "Nurturing Parenting" curriculum, which provide parenting skills training and resource management, and has been adapted to Hawaii's diverse culture. *Child care provided.*

Parent-Child Mobile Outreach Program (MOP) is more widely known as Keiki Play Morning. MOP units are an early intervention community service across the state of Hawaii. This program seeks to educate in a non-threatening environment and link parents and their children to the appropriate resources that help meet their needs in the areas of health, nutrition, education, parenting skills, psychosocial and mental health. TIFFE's Mobile Outreach Program offers an array of components such as, play groups, parenting classes, infant massage, and much more. Nurturing the Fathers of Hawai'i Program is a 13-week group-based program for developing attitudes & skills for male nurturance. Facilitation training is also available to the community and other agencies.

Empowerment Through The Application of Protective Factors

TIFFE will be hosting a series of statewide workshops funded by the Hawaii Children's Trust Fund. The Ho'omana workshop series has been designed to help social/human services providers identify, understand, and implement the five protective factors. The protective factors are a set of specific strategies that allow both the parent and service provider to create a family strengthening care plan. The five protective factors include: (1) Nurturing & Attachment (2) Knowledge of Parent/Child development (3) Parental Resilience (4) Social Connections (5) Concrete Support for Parents. It is our belief that when the 5 protective factors are present it drastically reduces abuse and neglect. The next Oahu workshop will be on March 22nd.
